12th World Scout Youth Forum

- The 12th World Scout Youth Forum was held on 4 to 7 August 2014 with the theme "One Tree, Many Branches".
- There were185 youth participants from 75 countries
- The Forum revolved around "Our Movement, Our Community, Our Future".
- Mr Ahmad Alhendawi, United Nations Envoy on Youth, was keynote speaker on global trends and youth
- The forum appreciated outgoing Youth Advisors -- Doina Postica (Moldova), Esben Holager (Denmark), Felipe de Paulo (Brazil), Sarah-Rita Kattan (Lebanon) and Vemund Ovesen (Norway) for their commitment and work during the 2011-2014 Triennium.
- newly-elected Youth Advisors are Daiana Neil (Argentina), Jeremy Apert (France), Luis Antonio Aguayo Miranda (Mexico), Maire Fitzger ald (Ireland), Maeed Mohamed Zahir (Maldives) and Montaser Hosny Abdelmaged (Egypt), who will be working alongside the World Scout Committee in the 2014-2017 Triennium.

40th World Scout Conference

- The conference had nearly 1400 participants and support team members from 130 countries for what is the largest international event in the history of Slovenia.
- Jernej Stritih, President of the Slovenian National Scout Organization, welcomed all delegates to the Conference
- John May, Vice-Chairperson of the World Scout Committee, read a very inspiring keynote address from former President of the Republic of Poland, Lech Walesa
- Monaco and South Sudan were welcomed as new WOSM members
- World Scout Committee Chairman, Simon Rhee reported on the numerous achievements of the outgoing World Scout Committee as contained in the Triennial Report 2011-2014.
- Scott Teare, Secretary General of WOSM, delivered his report entitled "Unity in diversity and paid tribute to his predecessor, Luc Panissod, for many of the initiatives that he started as Secretary General.

- John Geoghegan, Director of the World Scout Foundation, invited delegates to focus on the social impact of Scouting in order to help raise more resources for the Movement worldwide
- President of the Republic of Slovenia, Mr. Borut Pahor, gave the key note address at the opening ceremony.
- Delegates were invited to attend a number of different interac tive World Scouting Showcase sessions, including scout.org, Youth for Change, Educational Methods., 21st Century Leadership, Global Support and the 12th World Scout Youth Forum Outcomes.
- Delegates debated specific issues in break-out sessions which dealt with Global Issues, Transparency in Decision-Making, Duty to God and Human Rights

- João Armando Gonçalves from Portugal became the new Chairperson of the World Scout Committee. João will be supported by two Vice-Chairpersons: Jemima Nartey from Ghana, and Daniel Ownby from the United States of America.
- Azerbaijan won the bid to host the 41st World Scout Conference in 2017. This will be the first time the Eurasia Region welcomes a World Scouting event.
- Day Four ended with a High Level Partners Event entitled "Scouting a social force", with a keynote address from Corinne Woods, Director of the United Nations Millennium Campaign
- The event also marked the 10th anniversary of the Scouts of the World Award, the only award for youth granted by WOSM
- 40th Scout Conference closed with a new Vision 2023 and an ambitious 2014-2017 Triennial Plan.
- The Conference recognized three individuals, Mario Diaz Martinez, Derek Twine, and M. Georges El-Ghorayeb who received the Bronze Wolf Award for outstanding service to Scouting.
- In his closing statement, João Armando Gonçalves, Chairperson of the World Scout Committee, declared: "The implementation of the new Strategy for WOSM that you have just approved, is a golden opportunity, not only to increase our social impact, but also to strengthen our internal relations and reinforce the common values. Because we will all be working together in making Scouting the "world's leading educational youth movement."
- During the closing ceremony, Scott Teare, Secretary General of WOSM, said: "All of us came here with a positive spirit. We showed the world why Scouting is such a special Movement that cuts across cultures, age and boundaries." In his report to the World Conference, he stated that Scouting is a Movement of young people, supported by adults.

4th International Patrol Jamboree

The 4th International Patrol Jamboree was held from 1 to 6 August, Sangju, Gyeongsangbuk-do. We had 8,000 scouts from 45 countries. There were more than 20 activities, such as paragliding, Ironman award, Sangju trekking, Orienteering, Hwarang award, Sinnari award, Horse-riding.

Besides, there was an International Youth Forum with 80 participants including oversea Scouts.

Hwarang award and Ironman award are the most popular programs of Korea Scout so many scouts joined to get those awards. Also, the National Agricultural Cooperative Federation put up an activity zone showing how to eat right food. The International Night & Sangju Night was crowded and enjoyed by all with Superstar J.

Dharmaraja Scouts create history with Guinnness World Record

The 1st Kandy Dharmaraja Scout Group celebrated the Centenary of Scouting with establishing a Guinness World Record's by creating the world largest neckerchief measures $53.7m \times 37.1 m$ (176 ft 2.4 inches x 125 ft 8.4 inches x 121 ft 8.4 inches) and the world largest woggle measures 1.03m (3 ft 4.55 inches) in diameter and 1m (3 ft 3.37 inches) in height.

This record was measured at the Dharmaraja College, Kandy in February 2014 by the official record adjudicators authorized to verify the authenticity of the setting and breaking of records employed by the Organization of Guinness World Records.

The aim of this event is to wave Dharmaraja colors in the most prestigious and worldwide selling book while celebrating 100th anniversary of 1st Kandy Dharmaraja Scout Group and organized by the Rover Crew of 1st Kandy Dharmaraja Scouts.

The 1st Kandy Dharmaraja Scout Group's very first great achievement was wining of the "King's Flag" which they won for three consecutive years, 1917, 1918 and 1919. This flag was traditionally awarded to a troop in the British Colonies that had the largest number of King Scouts on September 30 in each year. In those years the number of colonies in the British Empire was quite a considerable number and no other troop in the colonies could emulate that achievement. The 1st Kandy Dharmaraja Scout Group was formed by late John Henry de Saram, the Ceylon's first native Chief Commissioner of Ceylon Scout Movement in 1913 with the assistance of late K. F. Billimoria, then principal of Dharmaraja College, Kandy.

In addition to the Guinness World Record, 1st Kandy Scouts were awarded the Sri Lanka's 'Best Scout Group Award' consecutively for three years from 2009 to 2011 at the Annual Awards Ceremony organized by the Sri Lanka Scout Association, last week at the Royal College, Colombo.

The Venturer unit are planning another trip to Aituttaki to further promote Scouting on the island and in particular the establishment of a local Venturer Unit.

Digital Engagement Lead. The Digital Engagement Lead is responsible for the overall management of all global social media channels of the World Organization of Scout Movement (WOSM) and content of the website (scout. org).

He/She is responsible for monitoring, managing, maintaining and improving the performance of the digital channels of WOSM including the content of the website (scout.org) and global social media channels of WOSM, as well as the overall digital presence of WOSM. This includes building and maintaining close working relationships in digital engagements with WOSM's key stakeholders.

Editor & Lead Writer. The Editor & Lead Writer is the message and content custodian of all publications and editorial products of the World Organization of Scout Movement (WOSM). He/She is responsible for developing and creating compelling ideas and stories that support and enhance the vision and profile of WOSM among stakeholders and the general public. He/She is responsible for setting the editorial and creative agenda of WOSM by providing the leadership and working closely with WOSM's key stakeholders including the Regional Offices (ROs) and National Scout Organizations (NSOs).

Social Media Manager. The Social Media Manager is responsible for the day-to-day management of the social media channels of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM). He/She manages all social media activities of WOSM including creating content and responding to queries on social media. The Manager takes care of the implementation of the World Scout Bureau's Digital Engagement Guidelines across all social media channels of WOSM.

Webmaster & Web Development Lead. The Webmaster & Lead Web Developer is responsible for managing, maintaining and improving the technical performance, functionalities and security of the website (scout.org) of the World Organization of Scout Movement (WOSM).

Director, Adults in Scouting. The Director, Adults in Scouting, is a member of the Scouting's Development team within the World Scout Bureau, reporting to the Global Director, Scouting's Development. The person filling this position is responsible for supporting the development of 'Volunteering' at Global and Regional levels, and in National Scout Organizations (NSOs), in line with the World Adult in Scouting Policy.

Director, World Events. The Director, World Events, is a member of the Scouting Development team within the World Scout Bureau, reporting to the Global Director, Scouting Development. His/her main mission is to lead the World Scout Bureau's actions in supporting the Host Committees of World Scout Events, as well as to support the World Scout Committee in exercising its Constitutional function to supervise the organisation of World Scout Events.
