30th APR Scout Jamboree opens in Japan

Today, the 1st of August, is a remarkable day for Scouting and to the over 14,000 Scouts who will have another adventure of their lives at the 30th Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Jamboree/16th Nippon Jamboree at Kirara-hama in Yamaguchi, Japan.

Filling up the grounds of Kirara-hama are contingents from 53 countries from around the world. The Jamboree officially opens today with the presence of Mr. Shigetaro Yamamoto, Yamaguchi Prefectural Governor, and the Director-General of the Education Ministry Mr Yoshio Yamawaki, together with Regional Chairman Dr Chao Shou-Po.

In the coming days, from 1st to 8th August, participants will be all over the campsite, on-site and off-site, to join many activities. One of them is the Global Development Village which is designed to raise awareness of global issues from six perspectives: peace, environment, health, human rights, development, and disaster mitigation. Activities are in collaboration with 16 NGOs and NPOs such as the World Food Programme, United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-HABITAT), Plan Japan, among others.

Appreciating cultures will be another eye-catcher at the arena through music, dance, costumes and crafts of Japan and that of other countries. In addition, a booth of the World Organization of the Scout Movement will run workshops to engage Scouts as Messengers of Peace. Various programs will trigger the Scouts' curiosity in science, and they will know more about local communities with visits to 19 towns and cities in Yamaguchi.

Nature is definitely a part of the adventure while exploring the Yamaguchi countryside. And there's the Hiroshima Peace Programme which aims to deepen appreciation why we strive for peace with a visit to the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum and Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park. On a smaller scale, sub camp life is another way for participants to experience living away from home and families, this time, sharing daily routine with patrols and units.

This Regional Jamboree is a pre-Jamboree of the 23rd World Scout Jamboree to take place at the same campsite in 2015.

President of the Republic of Bangladesh takes oath as Chief Scout

His Excellency the President, Abdul Hamid, took oath as the Chief Scout of Bangladesh on 30th July at a ceremony at Darbar Hall of Bangabhaban in Dhaka. High public officials as well as Bangladesh Scouts leaders including awardees joined the ceremony. The Chief National Commissioner of Bangladesh Scouts Mr. Md. Abul Kalam Azad administered the oath and adorned him with a national scarf.

During the ceremony, 125 Scouts and 3 Rover Scouts were also presented the `President Scouts Award' and President Rover Scout Award for the year 2011 and 2012.

The President was happy to know that Bangladesh Scouts started some activities for acquiring IT skills. He

asked the Scouts to increase their knowledge in IT and to step forward to become part of the country's socio-economic advancement. The Bangladesh government always provides co-operation and assistance for development and expansion of the Scout activities. "This assistance will be extended further", he assured.

They received their awards from President Tony Tan Keng Yam, who is also Chief Scout of Singapore.

The Singapore Scout Foundation seeks to bring together friends of Singapore Scouting who are committed to developing the Movement for the benefit of this and future generations of young Singaporeans. Over \$1 million has been raised by the Foundation since its establishment last year.

Two national camps aim for appreciation of agriculture and special needs

Two national Scout camps were held in Indonesia recently. First, the National Community Service Camp for the Agriculture Special Unit of Rover and Senior Rover. This camp was held in West Sumatra Province from 25 to 30 June 2013. The Indonesian Minister of Agriculture, Ir. H. Suswono, opened the camp in front of more 1,200 Rovers and Senior Rovers who came all the way from 33 provinces of Indonesia.

Indonesia is known as an agriculture country, and through this camp, Minister Suswono expressed hope that many young people would learn to appreciate farming and fisheries, even though many people nowadays tend to shy away from agriculture. This camp, said the Minister, "can be create a momentum to develop young farmers in Indonesia". With Indonesia's goal for food self-sufficiency, this move is to create a cadre of young movers for agricultural development. Participants of this community camp learned about the many aspects of agriculture and new technologies for farming and fishing.

"The seriousness of fostering this special unit in the past has produced many young cadres in agriculture area", he added. The Minister was accompanied by Chief Commissioner of Gerakan Pramuka, Prof.Dr. Azrul Azwar, and Deputy Governor of West Sumatra who is also the Chairman of Gerakan Pramuka in West Sumatera Province.

The other national Scout camp was held at Cibubur Scout Camp, from 30 June to 5 July 2013. More than 600 Scouts with special needs from many provinces in Indonesia participated in the camp. Officially opened by the Chief Commissioner of Gerakan Pramuka, Prof. Dr. Azrul Azwar, the camp attracted many young people with special needs.
