Dato Paduka Ar. Awang Haji Idris bin Haji Abas, President of Persekutuan Pengakap Negara Brunei Darussalam (PPNBD), delivered an inspiring message at the opening ceremony on 16 March. Participants of the planning process were 25 commissioners headed by Chief Commissioner Haji Awang Badar Haji Awang Ali. Director of the workshop was Haji Mohd. Zali bin Haji Arsad, supported by APR Director S Prassanna Shrivastava from the APR office.

Adult training improves leadership quality

10th Scouts of the World Discovery Workshop, Singapore

The Singapore Scout Association (SSA) held its 10th Scouts of the World Award (SWA) Discovery Workshop from 21st March to 23rd March 2014 at the Raffles Institution.

The 3-day workshop saw a total of 15 participants; eight of whom were international participants from Taiwan (5), Brunei (2) and Malaysia (one non-Scout).

Mr Malcolm BH Tan, Chairman of the Asia-Pacific Regional Management Sub- Committee, addressed the opening of the workshop and also presented the Scouts of the World Award to four Rover Scouts who had completed their Voluntary Service Project.

Since SSA adopted the SWA in late 2006, the Discovery Workshops have always been ever-evolving with new ideas and methods to relate and relay important messages on peace, development and the environment to participants. With a strong focus on experiential learning, one of the new activities introduced during the 10th workshop was a poverty stimulation game adapted from TEAR Australia. It was well received by the participants, many of whom expressed that it allowed them to understand poverty issues better through an engaging activity.

"I am amazed by how the Singapore Scout Association has taken the Scouts of the World Award to a level that really benefits young people of Rover age", said Syd Castillo of World Scout Bureau/APR after experiencing the entire workshop.

The Scouts of the World Programme in Singapore has thus far touched the lives of almost 150 young adults, both local and international, and will continue to reach out to more young people to foster a better understanding of our global community. — Thanks to Tan Sijie, Singapore Scout Association

Earth Hour Singapore 2014

Earth Hour has made Singapore its home since 2012 and this year, all eyes were once again turned to Singapore on 29 March 2014, as she hosted Spider-Man, Earth Hour's global super hero ambassador.

Held at The Float @ Marina Bay, which overlooks the beautiful skyline of the Marina Bay area, Earth Hour Singapore 2014 witnessed thousands of people turning up to show

their support and to catch hold of the star cast members of the Amazing Spider-Man 2. The event saw a record participation from 350 organisations, with more than 60 iconic structures across the Marina Bay skyline 'blacked out' during the hour.

For the 6th consecutive year since Earth Hour began in 2009, The Singapore Scout Association (SSA) has lent its helping hand as a supporting partner to the event managed by WWF Singapore. An increase in participation has been seen every year, and 2014 saw the largest participation of more than 1,500 Scouts and 64 volunteers.

The theme for this year's Earth Hour is that every person has the power to be a superhero by making small changes to save the planet. This includes adjusting the air-conditioning up by 1 degree, using fewer plastic bags, switching to power-saving LED lights, and taking shorter showers.

The event saw thousands of people and their pledges to use their power to reduce to save the Earth. This was on top of the effort to do so at the pledge centre at the SSA Headquarters prior to the Earth Hour event.

SSA's booth was also privileged to receive a visit from Dr Marco Lambertini, the incoming Director-General of WWF International.

Remembering a good Scout leader

Dr Azrul Azwar, member of Regional Scout Committee (2009-2012; 2012-2015) and former Chief Commisioner/ Chairman of Gerakan Pramuka Indonesia (2003-2008; 2008-2013), passed away in the afternoon of 1st April 2014, at the National General Hospital in Jakarta.

Born in Kutacane, Aceh, on 6 June 1945, he was a medical doctor who specialized in community health. He was also a professor at the University of Indonesia, and a Director General for Community Health in the Ministry of Health.

Azrul was married to Dr. Rhina Azrul Azwar, his classmate at the Medical Faculty University of Indonesia and has three children: Aidil Nusantara, Ilham Samudera, and Imam Dirgantara, with three grandchildren, all girls.

In Scouting world, Azrul was known as one of the founding members of the ASEAN Scout Association for Regional Cooperation (ASARC) and served as President of ASARC from 2007-2012. In the health world, Azrul was active in several positions: consultant, World Health Organization (WHO); consultant, International Organization for Migration (IOM); Vice President Medical Association of ASEAN, President World Medical Association (WMA); President Confederation of Medical Association in Asia & Oceania (CMAAO); Chairman of the ASEAN Regional Primary Health Care Cooperation (ARPAc).
