25th APR Scout Conference, Korea

Participation. The 25th Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Conference held on 3-8 November 2015 in Gwangju City, Republic of Korea, was a milestone for Korea and regional Scouting. This was the second time that Korea hosted a Regional Conference. The first was 47 years ago, in 1968.

The regional conference involved over 500 people including participants, delegates, observers, guests and accompanying persons. This includes representatives from 24 National Scout Organizations in the Asia-Pacific Region, associate members Macau and French Polynesia, guests from potential countries (Timor Leste, Vietnam, Myanmar), and from other regions: USA, Iceland, UK, Sweden, Finland, and Poland.

To mark this historic event, Ms Kim Hui Jeong, Minister of Gender Equality and Family; Dr. Hahm Jong Han, KSA President; João Armando Gonçalves, Chairperson, World Scout Committee; and Scott Teare, WOSM Secretary General were present at the Conference.

Dr John C. H. Nam delivered the keynote speech. He said, "growth not only in quantity, but also quality. This is because without quality, no amount of quantity can be guaranteed".

He encouraged that the Region continue to nurture talented young leaders, accumulate financial resources by creating the world's best ideas, and increase the speed and rate of innovation that match the changing needs of customers.

Other organizations were also present namely ISGF-APR, Habitat for Humanity, World Scout Shop, WWF, ICCS and WAGGGS.

New Regional Scout Committee. The conference elected five new members of the Regional Scout Committee for 2015-2021. Elected members are Mr Ahmad Rusdi (Indonesia), Mr Bhaidas Ishwar Nagarale (India), Mr Chay Hong Leng (Singapore), Mr Ie-Bin Lian (Scouts of China), and Mr Ahmed Ali Maniku (Maldives). Mr Pattaroj Kamonrojsiri will serve from 2015-2018 after replacing Mr Md Abul Kalam Azad who resigned from the post. In addition, Mr. Mori Cheng Chi-Kin (Hong Kong), chairman of the Young Adult Members Group, is a full-fledged member of the Regional Committee.

APR Plan 2015-2018 adopted. After a review of the draft APR Plan 2015-2018 by the conference breakout group, some changes were made on the proposed plan, which were later adopted at the conference plenary. The final plan will be distributed to all NSOs and regional members in January 2016.

Awardees. The recognition ceremony at the end of the conference gave tribute to leaders for their outstanding services to the Scout Movement. Tan Cheng Kiong, Chief Commissioner of The Singapore Scout Association was conferred the APR Award for Distinguished Service. The Medal for Meritorious Contribution to Scouting was awarded to Ghous Ali Shah (Pakistan), Dick and Pip Smith (Australia), and Chung Ui Hwa (RO Korea). A number of outstanding leaders received the Chairman's Award: Malcolm Tan Ban Hoe (Singapore), Dr Jeffrey Ho Kai Kwong, (Singapore), Danny Hong Seung-Soo (Republic of Korea), Dr Mohammed Mukhyuddin bin Sarwani (Malaysia), Joseph Lau Yee-Leung (Hong Kong), Richard Joseph Miller (Australia), Ian Langford-Brown (Australia), Dr Prapatpong Senarith (Thailand), Ho Yan-man Hubert (Hong Kong), and Syd Castillo (APR).

Outstanding Scouts. After an extensive pre-selection process both at national and regional level, candidates for the APR Outstanding Scouts Award were finally selected through an invidiual interviews by a panel at the conference. Winners are Jayvy R. Gamboa (Philippines), Chow Yikman Edwin (Hong Kong), and Angus Boxall (Australia), with Lee Seung Seok (Korea) as runner-up.

APR Course for Leader Trainers

The Asia-Pacific Regional Course for Leader Trainers 2015 took place at the Suncheon Asia-Pacific Scout Centre in Suncheon, Korea. There were 13 NSOs with 33 participants (including 9 female members) and 13 training team members from Australia, Bangladesh, Brunei, Scouts of China, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand.

The purpose of a regional CLT is to have a regional standard of adult training of trainers, and it is a rare occasion for aspiring and potential Leader Trainers to attend the only Course for Leader Trainers with regional status, and provide opportunity for course participants to attend the conference after the course. It also provides opportunity for small NSOs, which lack qualified trainers, to build capacity in quality adult training and development.

The seven-day course covered five modules - Scout Knowledge, Training Skills, Adult Learning Skills, Leadership Skills, and Personal Development Skills.

The course was hosted by Korea Scout Association, supported by the Adult Support Sub-Committee and managed by a team of full pledged regional trainers from the APR Specialists Panel.

Course Leader was Mr Shim Sang-Ho, who is also an APR Scout Committee member; Director of KSA National Training Centre Mr Hong Teok Jong. Among those present include Dr Lee Bok-Yie, Chairman of 25th APR Scout Conference Host Committee; Mr Rajalingam Ramasamy, Chairman of Adult Support Sub-Committee; Ms Opal Ho, YAMG Chairperson; Mr Peter Blatch, World Scout Committee member; Mr Paul Parkinson, APR Scout Committee member; Anas Alabbadi of KAICIID; Cynthia Marquez Cardoza of Global Support Office; Mr Syd Castillo, Director of Youth Programme; Thian Hiong-Boon, Director of Adult Resources and Administration.

King of Sweden revisits Typhoon Haiyan Rehabilitation

Nearly two years after his first visit to Tacloban City to personally see the devastation caused by super Typhoon Haiyan, His Majesty The King of Sweden, Carl XVI Gustaf revisited the place on 21 November 2015, and was impressed by the improvements he saw during his six-hour stay in the city.

After the plane landed, His Majesty held a press conference and proceeded to the construction site of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines Leyte Council Scout Office, which was destroyed by the storm surge. His Majesty wanted to see for himself the progress of the construction of a two-story BSP-Leyte Council building, funded by the World Scout Foundation, whom he is the Honorary Chairman.

His Majesty also met the parents of the Scouts who are beneficiaries of a livelihood project that he sponsored providing the families with motorised banca, carabaos, and funds to rebuild their houses.

At his personal request, The King also met with the Scouts of Ticket to Life Project in Malate, Manila where he was very happy to see old faces from his last visit. He met the new batch of Scouts, which was inspired by his advise to start with younger Scouts. Scout Jerwin returned the favor when he offered the Ticket to Life Scarf to His Majesty.

BSP National President Hon. Jejomar C. Binay came at the royal send-off in the evening of 21st November.

SG50 Singapore International Jamboree

"Scout is synonymous with a good deed a day. And we hope that when we go out there we can inspire people around us. All our fellow Singaporeans will continue to do so", shared by Desmond Chong, Camp Chief of the SG50 Singapore International Jamboree, when interviewed by Channel News Asia.

Singapore Scout Association organised the international jamboree to celebrate Singapore's 50th birthday and to provide a platform to Scouts and Scout leaders from different countries where they can enjoy the exciting and empowering programmes and establishing the Scouting ties.

The five-day jamboree ran from 18-22 November 2015 at the Sarimbun Scout Camp in Lim Chu Kang, where close to 2,500 scouts from 18 countries have gathered including France and United States.

President Tony Tan Keng Yam, Chief Scout of the Singapore Scout Association hosted a tea reception for delegation leaders and youth representatives on 19 November.

Deputy Prime Minister was at the opening and spoke about how Scouting encourages youth development because of its emphasis on helping other people.

Moreover, acting Education Minister (Schools) Ng Chee Meng also announced the launch of the "One Million Good Deeds" Campaign for 2016.

"This is a manifold increase from the 'One Thousand Good Acts' launched last year," he said. "I am impressed with the ambition and courage of SSA to use their influence for the good of the community. Nothing is too hard for all of us if we put our collective minds to it and go about getting it done."

Highlight of the closing ceremony was the items Scouting for Boys book and badges were placed into a time capsule, which will be buried at the Singapore Scouts' headquarters until 2045.

9th National Scout Jamboree 2016

Sri Lanka Scout Association with a history of 103 years will be holding the 9th National Scout Jamboree in Jaffna from 20-26 February 2016, which also coincides with the centenary of Scouting in Jaffna. Chief Commissioner Prof. Nimal de Silva said that this is the first time a National Scout Jamboree is being held in the Northern Province and requested the support of everyone to make it successful.
