Myanmar Focus: Registration System and Quality Training

Organizing back to back workshop is a recent strategy for WOSM Asia-Pacific Region to fast track its support to Myanmar Scouts. Many months before Myanmar Scouts' application for re-entry to the World Organization of the Scout Movement, APR Support Centre conceived a roadmap to strengthen its foundation structure starting with the people that comprise it – young people and adult members. This necessitates developing a registration system to set records and procedures for a growing association with already 25,000 members across the country.

With the leadership of Myanmar Scouts Chief Commissioner Dr. Tin Nyo, 31 Scout leaders from different districts of Myanmar gathered in Yangon for the registration system workshop, facilitated by two qualified resource persons – Regional Director JR Pangilinan, who shared his vast knowledge in registration system having served for many years at local and national offices of Boy Scouts of the Philippines. Also a resource person, Lai Kwok Chin, Vice-Chairman of APR Scouting Profile Sub-Committee, shared his expertise from the Singapore Scouts' experience using his own IT background.

Chairman of Myanmar's Regional Parliament U Tin Maung Htun, who is proud to have been a Scout, attended the opening ceremony. Scouting in Myanmar has been school-based prior to its dissolution in 1964 and on its recent revival in 2012. Leaders attribute Scouting's reintroduction in Myanmar to the country's former President, Mr Thein Sein.

Next step: quality training

"A National Training System is vital for Scout Leaders to effectively deliver quality youth programme," said Regional Director J. Rizal C. Pangilinan to participants attending the Workshop on Drafting a National Training System for Myanmar Scouts from 16-19 July 2016.

A bigger international team joined Myanmar Scouts to share their technical expertise in training and to show solidarity to the enthusiastic group of 42 participants from different provinces of Myanmar. Dr. Pattaroj Kamonrojsiri expressed support on behalf of the Regional Scout Committee.

Cambodia Scouts: Being Prepared for any eventuality

Cambodia Scouts, aiming for safe and responsible Scouting, organized a National Risk Management Workshop in Phnom Penh from 18 to 22 July 2016. With 45 participants from 25 provinces and local councils, most are Scout Leaders who are keen to learn techniques for preparing for any eventuality.

The workshop started with the objective of formulating a national risk management policy in accordance to the World Scout Conference Resolution with focus on "Safe from Harm" and the United Nations Policy on Child Protection.

Discussions focused on using the principle of mitigating critical situations by having appropriate counter measures or plan for any untoward incident.

The workshop was made possible through the joint partnership of Cambodia Scouts, the Office of the Council of Ministers, the Ministry of Education and the World Scout Bureau Asia-Pacific Support Centre. Sessions were delivered by widely experienced resource persons, Jamal Harim Abdullah (Malaysia) and Philip Gregory Harrison (Australia).

Mongolia: Involving people with special needs into Scouting

A mixed group of 24 participants including Cub Scout Leaders, Scout leaders and Rovers attended a workshop focused on young people with special needs in Scouting from 25-29 June 2016, at the national campsite in Bat-Sumer, about 3 hours west of Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.

"It was a great learning experience for all involved. It was valuable to share different ways to involve people with special needs into Scouting. The enthusiasm and experiences shared at the workshop will assist in making Scouting available to all young people in Mongolia. The creativity and commitment of the leaders make Scouting even stronger," said Peter Blatch, the main resource person for the event. Syd Castillo of APR office coordinated and facilitated the event.

Another milestone for Nepal Scouts was recorded on 26 June 2016 after Scouter Prakash Raj Pandey successfully reached the summit of Baden Powell Scout Peak or locally known as Urkema Peak.

The Scout Peak is 5,890 meters high, located at the Lantang Valley north of Kathmandu, and was named by the Government of Nepal after Lord Baden Powell in 2007, highlighting the 100 years of Scouting.
