APR and Australia visit Scouts in Timor Leste

Dili, Timor-Leste, 21 December 2016 – A high level team from the APR Asia-Pacific Region (APR) of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) visited Scouts in Timor Leste. The team comprised of Regional Scout Committee Chairman Paul Parkinson, Regional Director J. Rizal C. Pangilinan and Chief Commissioner of Scouts Australia Chris Bates.

This bilateral meeting of top leaders both from União Nacional dos Escuteiros de Timor-Leste (UNE-TL) and the APR team was to verify the preparations of UNE-TL in its application for WOSM membership. National Commissioners directly involved in the preparation joined the meeting held at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Dili.

On the first day meeting, the National Council led by the UNE-TL President Ms Idelta Maria Rodrigues went through the checklist of key areas such as constitution, organization structure, government recognition, membership, and infrastructure.

A meeting with Nobel Peace Prize winner and former President of Timor-Leste and Patron of UNE-TL, Dr. Jose Ramos-Horta, was arranged at his residence in Dili. Dr. Jose Ramos-Horta gave assurance to encourage government leaders, both present and future, to support the application of UNE-TL to WOSM.

"It is important that our colleagues in APR chaired by Mr. Paul Parkinson made this visit to UNE-TL to discuss and verify the membership requirements. We are also grateful for their support in the initial stages. We know that the chance to become WOSM member is high which now depends on UNE-TL leaders to prepare and anticipate the preliminary meeting in February 2017 with the WOSM team", said Idelta Maria Rodriquez.

UNE-TL has been recognized by the government of Timor Leste since its establishment in December 2005. Scouts from Timor Leste participated in many Scouting events around the Asia-Pacific Region as well as in events organized by WOSM.

During its 11 years of existence, UNE-TL gained strong support from the local authorities. This is reflected in the increase of members in many municipalities and regions of Timor Leste.

Scouting in Myanmar now 100 years old

Myanmar Scout celebrated 100 years of Scouting in the country on 23 December 2016. Scouts and key leaders of Myanmar were joined by Regional Scout Committee member Dr. Pattaroj Kamonrojsiri in a special ceremony.

Republic of the Union of Myanmar State Counsellor, H.E. Aung San Suu Kyi, joined the jubilee celebration at the hall of Yangon University. Aung San Suu Kyi said "The Scout motto is be prepared. This means that whatever challenges appear in life, there are many ways to overcome them".

A preparatory celebration as an opening salvo to the centenary started in November with the participation of Regional Director J. Rizal C. Pangilinan, Regional Scout Committee First Vice-Chairman Atty. Wendel Avisado, Management Sub-Committee Chairman Dr. Somboon Bunyasiri, and Mr Kwon Gu Yeon, Secretary General of Korea Scout Association. Old and former Scouts of Burma Scouting were invited to the historic celebration.

This year, the World Organization of the Scout Movement welcomed Myanmar Scout as its 164th member and declared it as the National Scout Organization of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar. Scouting in Myanmar was disbanded in 1964. Redevelopment started in 2012 after a visit of a small regional team

All set for 17th National Jamboree adventure in India

About 25,000 Scouts, Guides and leaders of The Bharat Scouts and Guides and around 1,000 participants from different countries will join the adventure of 17th National Jamboree in Mysuru, Karnataka State from 29th December 2016 to 4th January 2017.

"Together for Better Tomorrow" is chosen as the Jamboree theme to emphasise the value of unity for a promising future.

Regional Director J. Rizal C. Pangilinan conveyed his hopes that the Jamboree will bring inspiration to young people in India to become responsible citizens and to truly live the values of Scouting.

The beauty of Vajiravudh National Scout Camp, located in Sriracha, Chonburi, Thailand blended well with the theme "Scouting for Mercy and Peace."

The adventure of Everything is Possible Jamboree held from 14-21 December 2016, concluded at Vajiravudh National Campsite in Siracha, Thailand.

Living up to the theme that Scouting has no borders, participants came from 13 countries, namely Australia, Thailand, Indonesia, Singapore, Maldives, India, Cambodia, Korea, Philippines, USA, UK Scouts, UK Guides, Vietnam and Sri Lanka.

Participants immersed in onsite activities comprised of shooting rifle range, challenge valley commando course, pioneering and Leave No Trace Environmental Course which is one of the main activities of this Jamboree.

Offsite activities were equally exciting with a full-day Bangkok adventure, exploring the Grand Palace and Wat Po; full day at Cartoon Network Water Park, and zoo visit where participants fed the rhinos, giraffe, elephants and lions.

What's Upcoming

WOSM's Leadership Workshop, Asia-Pacific Region

Following the positive reactions received for the Leadership In Scouting Workshop held during the Revisiting the Scout Method Workshop (Taiwan, August 2016), the Asia-Pacific Region will host a Leadership event to continue implementing the leadership model of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM).

We are pleased to announce that Boy Scouts of the Philippines, in collaboration with the Asia-Pacific Support Centre, will host a training workshop in Manilla, from 24 to 26 February 2017.

The workshop aims at exploring three different tracks based on different applications of the Leadership in Scouting model, as described below:

Track 1: Youth Programme

It will focus on various existing and imaginative ways of implementing the model in the Youth Programme (e.g.: as a framework for a national Jamboree or as the basis for a leadership badge).

Track 2: Adults in Scouting

It will cover several different ways of using the Leadership in Scouting model applied to the management of adults (e.g., NSOs' Scout leader training scheme; Wood Badge framework; or other adult training system).

Track 3: Organisational development

It will examine how the model can be useful for the organizational development of a troop, National Scout Organization (NSO) or Region (e.g., committee election processes; change management; and other aspects of organizational development).

Participants: Adults who hold a role as trainers or/and in the leadership of an NSO.

Working language:

As the working language of the seminar is English, NSOs are requested to select participants who can communicate and actively take part in English.

Eligibility

Participants and Unit Leaders

Male and female Scouts, aged 12 to 17 years old at the start of the Jamboree are eligible to take part in 31APRSJ. A unit will consist of four patrols, with each patrol consisting of 9 Scouts and an adult leader. Therefore, a unit will consist of four adult leaders and 36 Scouts.

International Service Team (IST)

In order to make Jamboree happen we need about 1,000 members of the International Service Team (IST). Members who are at least 18 years of age at the start of the Jamboree are welcome to join the IST. IST should be able to communicate in English and be ready to perform any task necessary for the Jamboree. In addition, they must attend the Jamboree as part of a National Contingent.

Jamboree Planning Team

We are currently recruiting members to support the planning of the Jamboree.

Jamboree Planning Team is open to experienced volunteers willing to offer voluntary services during the planning phases of the Jamboree. All applications must come through NSOs.

The Jamboree Site

The 31st Asia Pacific Regional Scout Jamboree will be held at Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.

The Jamboree Site: Nairamdal

Nairamdal is located in 27 kilometers from Ulaanbaatar city, capital of Mongolia. The ICC "Nairamdal" is a governmental children's organization, under the supervision of the Ministry of Human Development and Social Welfare of Mongolia.

Module Activities

Nomadic Centre

Nomadic life thrives in summer and survives in winter. Considering climatic conditions, especially during winter, such lifestyle may seem to the outside world to be a very hard way of living. There will be opportunities to play traditional games, songs and dances. Traditional games such as ankle bone, archery and putting up a Mongolian ger, riding a horse and two-hump camel. All participants will have a chance to take part in the traditional manly sports at Naadam Festival such as wrestling, archery and horse racing.

Global Development Village Centre

GDV will be an on-site module programme with the aim to raise awareness of global issues such as peace, environment, development, human rights and health, allowing participants to become active members of their global community through various exhibits, games, arts and audio-visual displays, discussions, and presentations.
